Who We Are

- Panel approved by Board of Supervisors (Dec 2016)
- 9 members appointed by and report directly to Board of Supervisors (Feb 2017)
- Enhance police legitimacy and <u>build and maintain trust</u> between citizens, Board of Supervisors, and Police Department by reviewing certain police investigations to ensure investigations are:
 - Accurate
 - Complete
 - Thorough
 - Objective
 - Impartial

What We Do

- Provide an independent process for commencing an Initial Complaint against the FCPD or its officers
- Review completed investigations of complaints of <u>abuse of authority</u> or <u>serious misconduct</u> by a FCPD officer when requested
- Hold public meetings to hear from complainants and to review investigations
- Hold public meetings on issues within our jurisdiction and on law enforcement policies and practices
- Issue an annual report on our activities and recommendations on FCPD policies, training, and practices
- Meet with Auditor on recommendations on use of force cases

Our Jurisdiction: Abuse of Authority and Serious Misconduct

- Use of abusive racial, ethnic or sexual language or gestures
- Harassment or discrimination based on race, color, sexual orientation, gender, religion, national origin, marital status, age, familial status, immigration status or disability
- Acting in a rude, careless, angry, retaliatory or threatening manner not necessary for self-defense
- Reckless endangerment of detainee or person in-custody; violation of laws or ordinances
- Other serious violations of the county or FCPD policies or procedures, including the FCPD Cannon of Ethics, that occur on or off duty

What the Independent Auditor Does

- Monitors and reviews FCPD internal investigations of <u>officer involved</u> <u>shootings</u>, <u>in-custody deaths</u> and <u>use of force</u> cases in which an individual is seriously injured or killed
- Monitors and reviews administrative investigations of public complaints of use of force
- Issues public reports for each reviewed internal/administrative investigation and an annual report including those reviews
- Makes public recommendations concerning revisions of Police Department policies, training, and practices
- Provides administrative support to the Police Civilian Review Panel and delivers the Panel's annual report to the Board of Supervisors

Independent Auditor Jurisdiction

- Officer Involved Shooting
- In-Custody Death
- Use of Force
 - Any physical strike or instrumental contact with an individual, or any significant physical contact that restricts an individual's movement
 - Force does not include escorting or handcuffing an individual who is exhibiting minimal or nor resistance
 - Merely placing an individual in handcuffs as a restraint in arrest or transport activities, simple presence of officers or patrol dogs, or police issuance of tactical commands does not constitute a reportable action


Our Limitations

- Panel cannot review complaints if the:
 - Complaint is under IPA's exclusive review
 - Incident occurred before Dec 6, 2016
 - Initial Complaint is filed more than 1 year after incident*
 - Review Request is filed more than 60 days after FCPD sends investigation completion notice to complainant*
 - Review Request is subject to pending criminal or civil proceeding in any trial court
- Panel has no jurisdiction to review Sheriff's Office or Federal law enforcement (i.e., ICE)
- Panel cannot take testimony or receive evidence

* Absent good cause.

Complaint Process

Complaint Form Submitted



What to Expect After Filing

- Initial Complaint Forward to FCPD for investigation; FCPD to provide Investigation Report within 60 days*
- **Review Request** Conduct initial review of the request
 - Initial Disposition Notice sent regarding jurisdiction (~30 days after receiving Investigation Report)
 - Suspend or defer review for pending criminal/civil proceeding
 - Panel Review Meeting may be convened to allow:
 - Complainant to state reasons for filing
 - Panel to ask questions regarding reasons
 - FCPD to answer questions about the investigation (i.e., evidence)
 - Invite anyone with investigation/incident information to contact FCPD
 - Issue public report on Panel's findings within 90 days after receiving Investigation Report*

* Panel may extend the deadline for completion for good cause.
