

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

5 Steps to Neighborhood Preparedness Workshop



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

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Mission Purpose

Citizen Corps Council

Harness the power of every individual through education, training, and volunteer service to make communities safer, stronger, and prepared to respond to threats of terrorism, crime, public health issues, and disasters of all kinds.

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History Citizen Corps Council

- After September 11, 2001, state and local governments increased opportunities for residents to become an integral part of protecting communities and supporting first responders.
- January 2002 The President of the United States launched Citizen Corps
- January 2003 The Fairfax County Board of Supervisors formed the local Citizen Corps Council



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WHO Citizen Corps Council

- A group of emergency-related volunteer organizations that meet regularly to coordinate and collaborate in emergency preparedness efforts.
- Each member of the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors appoints a Representative (Mason District = Marco ☺)
- Includes members of the local government, community partners, and citizens concerned with emergency preparedness.



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WHAT ROLES ACTIONS ACTIVITIES

- Promotes disaster preparedness and community resiliency by building partnerships and offering opportunities for collaboration.
- During times of an emergency, members and volunteers may be called to serve by fulfilling designated roles.
- The Fairfax County Department of Emergency Management and Security (DEMS) coordinates county planning, response, support, and recovery efforts before, during, and after large-scale events and emergencies.



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Building Resiliency

Council member organizations build resiliency in Fairfax County, and are active during Fairfax County emergencies and events such as:

Huntington Floods of 2006 and 2011

H1N1 Influenza 2009-2010

Presidential Inauguration 2009

Snowmaggedon of 2010

Derecho Storm of 2012

COVID-19 of 2020 – ongoing



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Community Outreach

- Educates the general public on how to prepare for emergencies and promotes volunteerism to further prepare the community.
- Participates in community events and seeks outreach opportunities.
- Patriciates in the Burke Festival and presents their signature event:
 Ready, Set, Know


