- Education & Youth Charlie Dane
  - Charlie wishes to step down as committee chair; instead he proposes they staff the Education Committee chair by committee with different individuals handling different responsibilities. Leonard Bumbaca has offered to develop the education portion of the Federation's legislative package, and will participate in the board and general meeting that deals with this package. Ed Saperstein has offered to develop the budget testimony and will participate in the board meeting in late January that approves the testimony. There is never enough time between the Superintendent's proposed budget and the public hearings to obtain approval at a membership meeting. Then, because of the timing of the BOS pass-back on the FCPS transfer amount, there has not been enough time for either general membership or board approval, so the May testimony on the draft approved budget is made on behalf of the Education Committee. Tim Thompson has offered to arrange for the committee's programs reserving rooms and scheduling speakers. And, he will send updates on education activities to the membership and board meetings as appropriate. As you know, we have a committed and informed eight member Education Committee, and he believes this arrangement will free up his time, but provide the Federation with the representation that should be expected.
