- Retention and turnover of teachers
- Fairfax County Public Schools receive only 15% of their budget from the State, which is significantly lower than the approximately 40% that other public school systems receive from their states
- FCPS started the school year with about 200 vacant positions (predominantly special education and math)
- Incentive pay; requires legitimate measures
